### FIBRES PLUS SALE

Alexis discussed the sale and asked whether the members were willing to volunteer as well as produce enough items to sell. Should it be an indoor or outdoor sale? A poll was taken.

**1<sup>st</sup> Poll** 63% would volunteer at an indoor sale, 38% were not willing. If the sale was outdoors, 94% were willing to volunteer at an outdoor event and 6% unwilling.

**2<sup>nd</sup> Poll** 100% were willing to volunteer at an outdoor event. 71% said they could have product to sell for a late summer sale while 29% could not. 76% could have product to sell at a November indoor sale while 24% could not.

Discussion continued about the importance of including demonstrations, an educational component and the personal connection to the textile artist at our sales. For this reason an
